# PLM 2.0 | Action fields

## PLM 2.0 focusing on SystemMaster enabling processes



### Global standard SMM



(example GV650)

**System Master** as the global connectivity standard for BSH

### Dependency Management

- **Dependencies** between SW/HW/RAC to be identified and checked for SW updates **over product lifetime**

### ALM/PLM Processes

- More SW focus (FW, Content) and regular updates require **standardized ALM Toolchain**

### Product/Variant Configuration Management

- **Amount of possible combinations** for variants needs **PLM supported configuration management**

### Manage data complexity

- dependencies
- Interfaces SW/HW
- new components
- (...)

### Improve efficiency

- Automatic processes
- Check of VA/VO
- Check of BOMs
- (...)

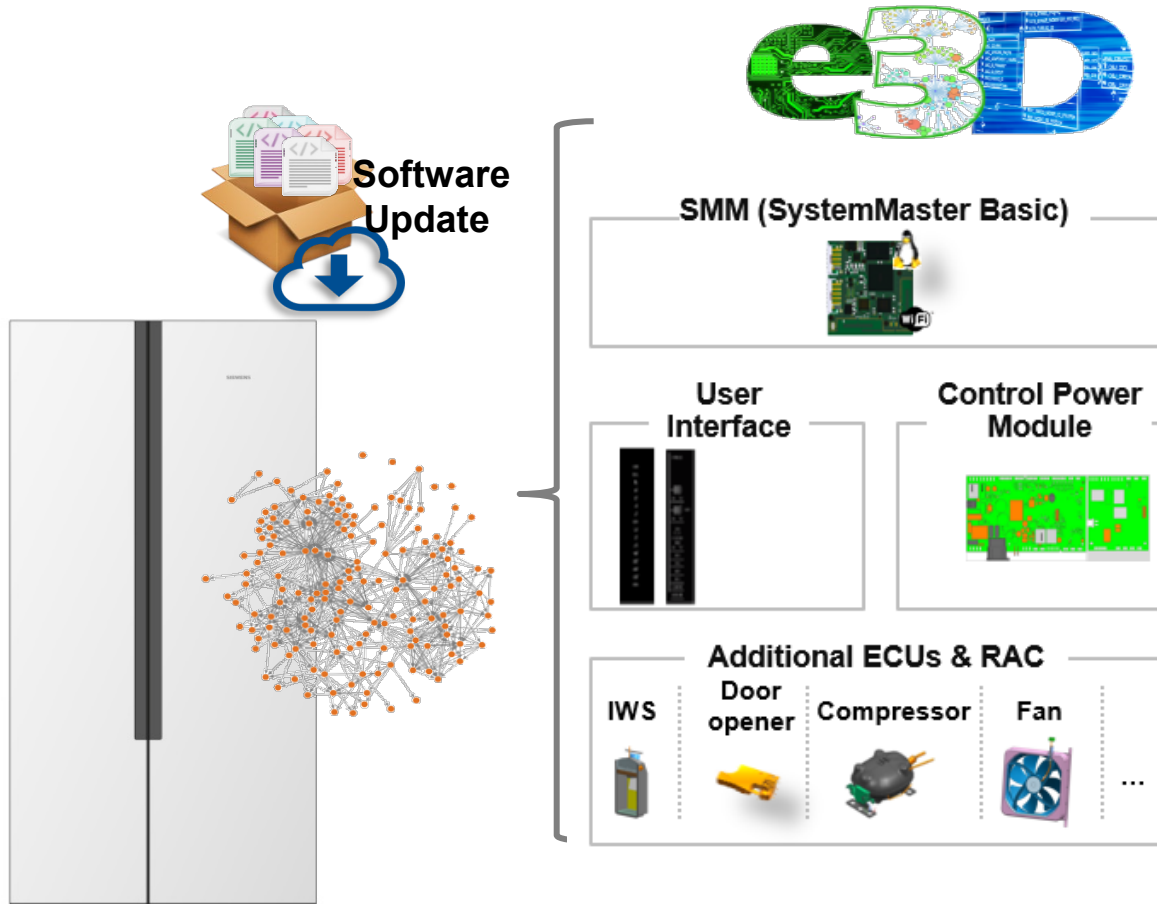

# PLM 2.0 Action Fields | Dependency Management

## Parts & Modules influencing the Software



 **Hardware Identification**  
→ they are **able to provide the identification information** to the Home Appliance  
→ Electronic (**PCB**) with (**D**)Bus connection

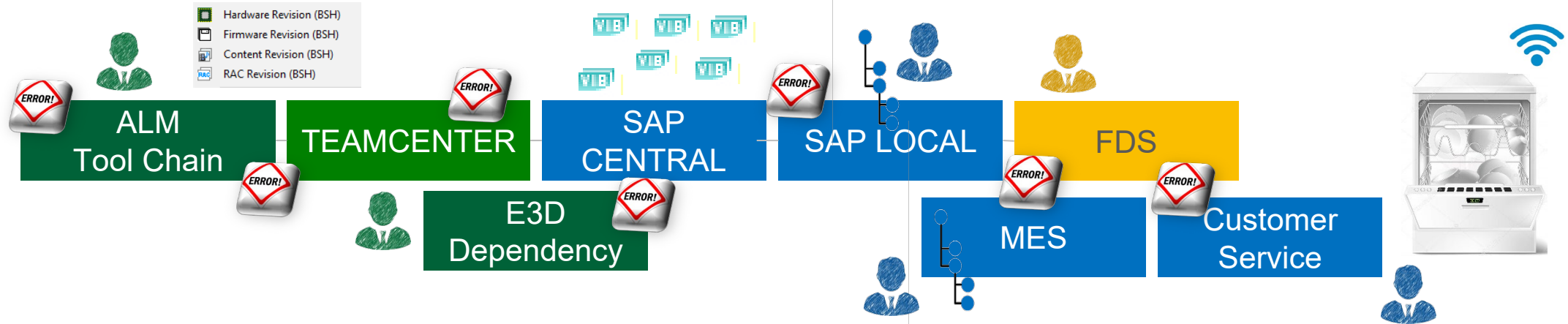
 **Firmware Identification**  
FW comprises **all kind software**, which is used to provide basis functionalities of an ECU.

 **RAC Identification (Restricting Additional Component)**  
they are **not able to provide the identification information** to the Home Appliance  
→ no (D)Bus connection  
→ **have an influence on the FW** running on the ECU

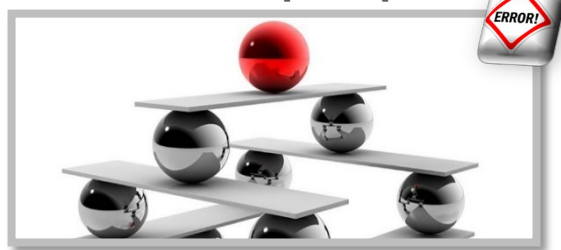
ECU = Electronic Control Unit  
FW = Firmware  
HW = Hardware  
RAC = Restricting Additional Component

# PLM 2.0 Action Fields | Product as Platform “Dashboard”

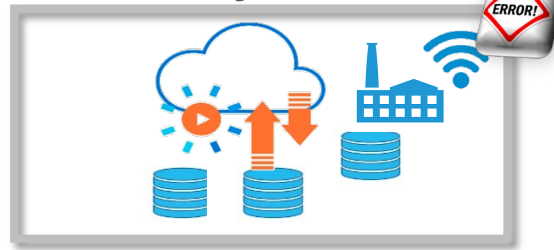
*to avoid small unknown errors along the process chain

Unstable system/ interface

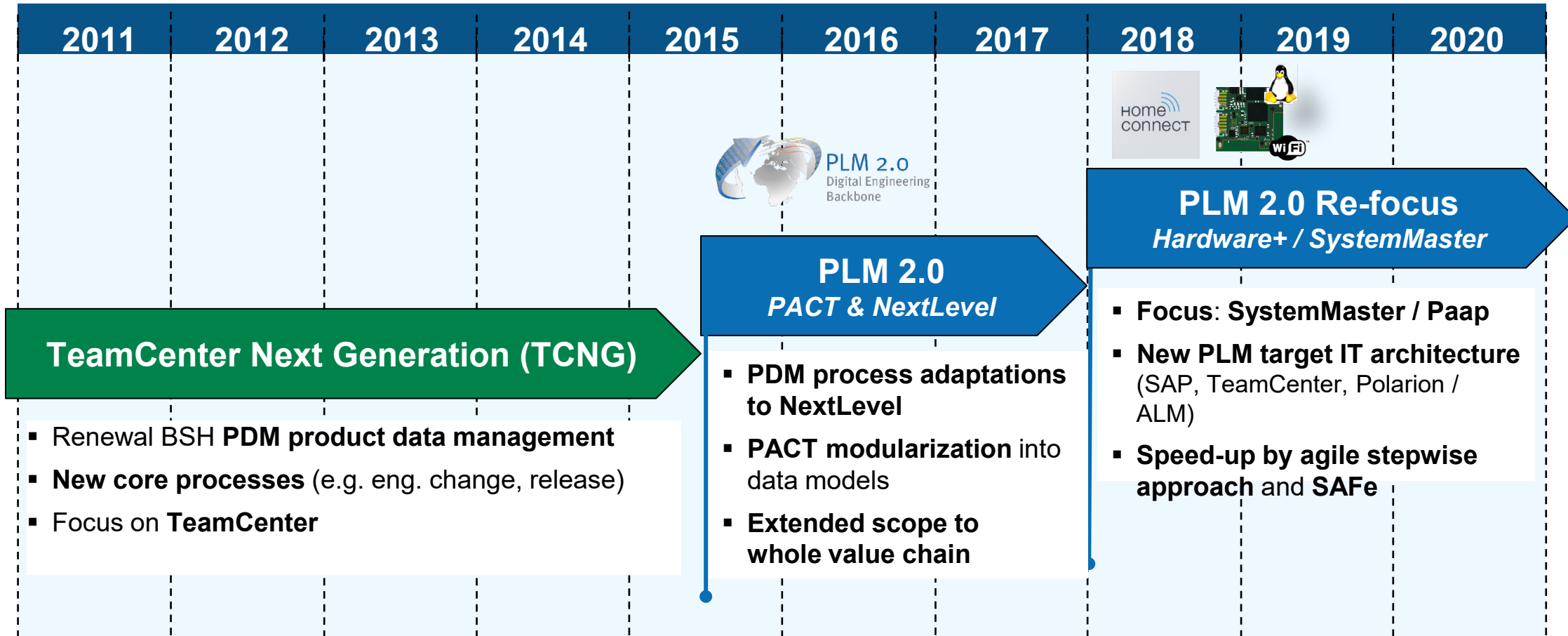

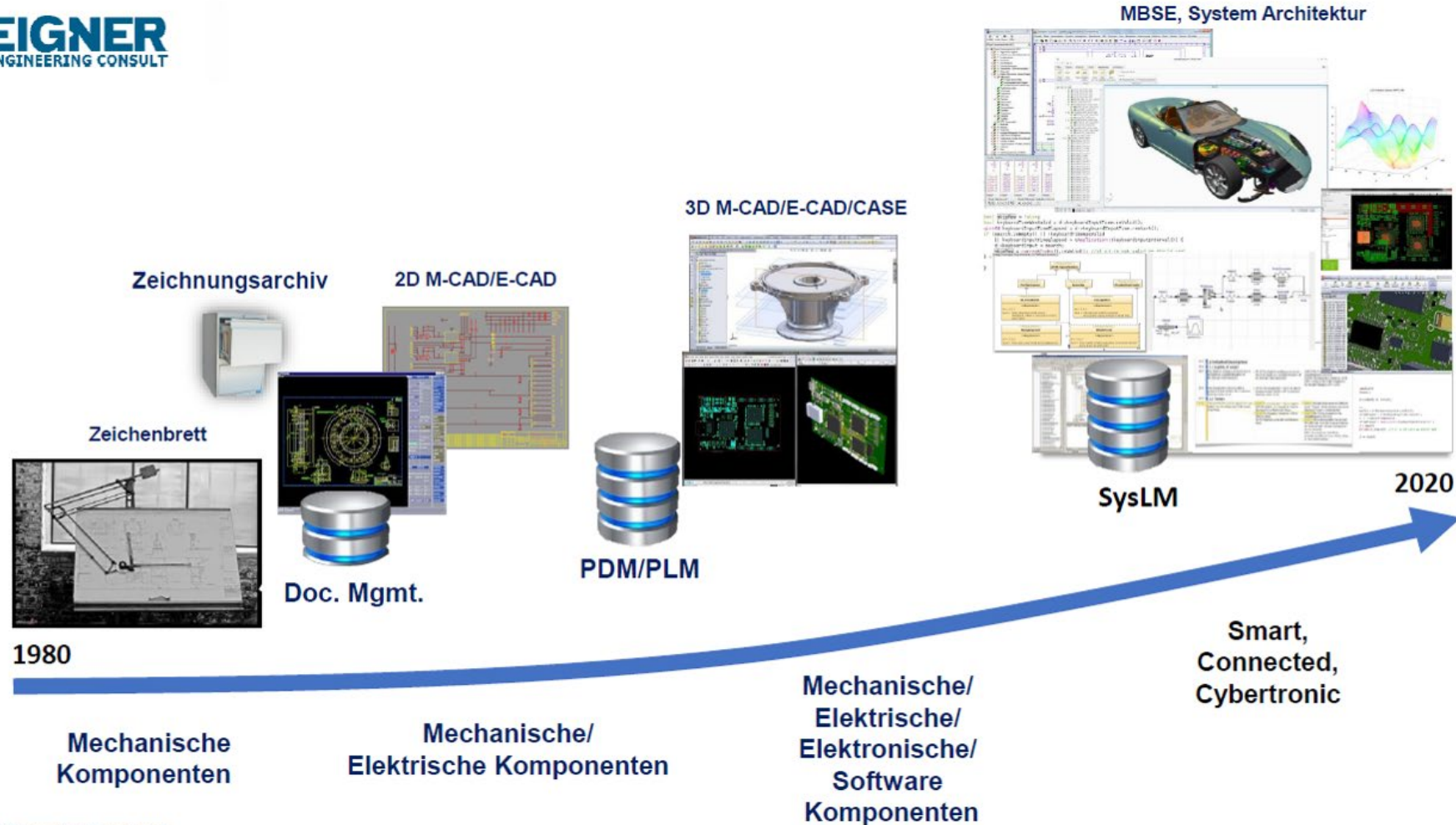

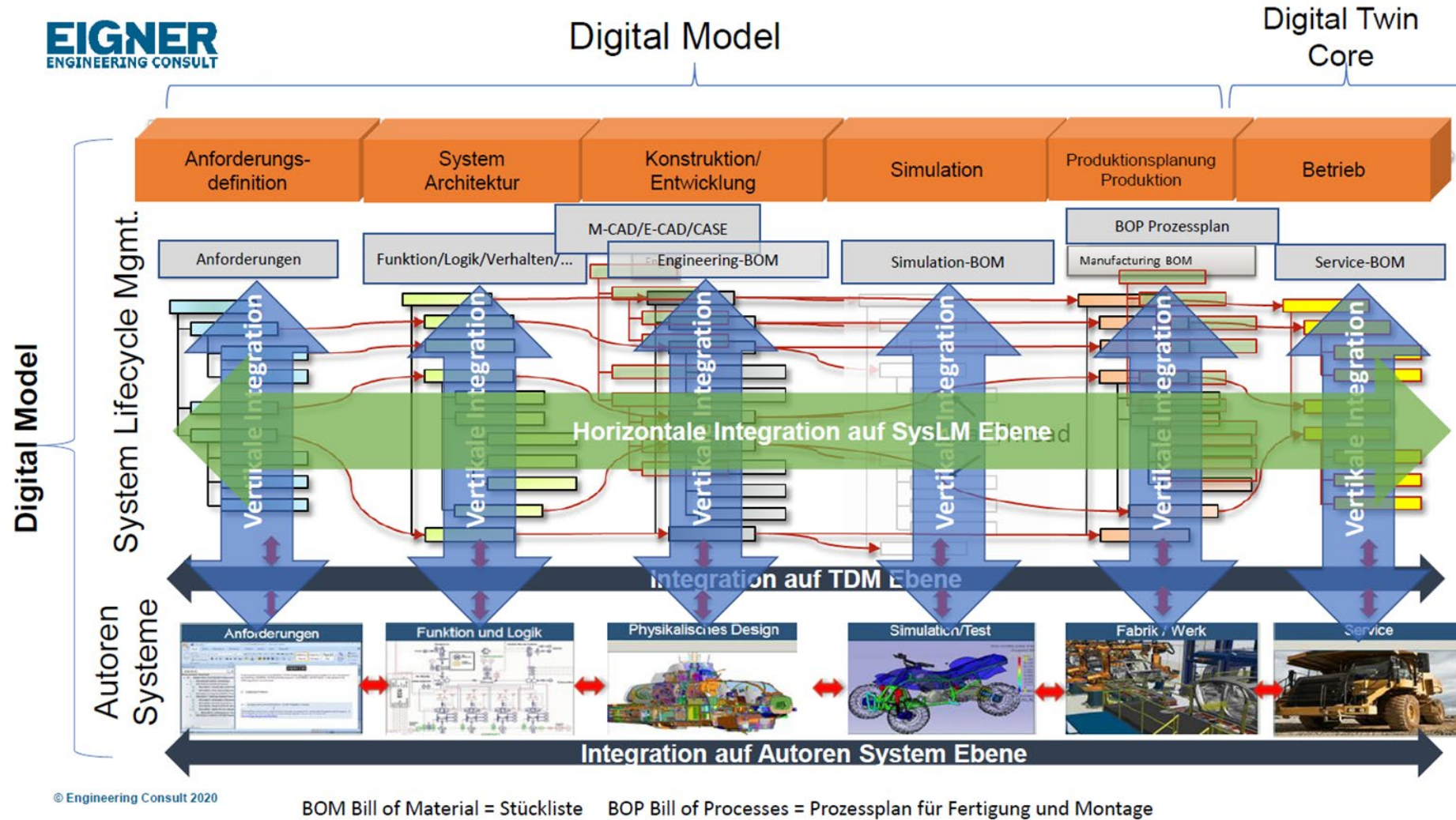
